



## **Codes of Conduct** **PACE Soccer Inc.**

The Codes of Conduct of **PACE Soccer** establish a clear set of guidelines and principles for all coaches, players and parents/guardians. The primary goal of the Codes of Conduct is to ensure that we create a learning environment that is fun, positive, safe and enjoyable, while adhering to the principles of the **PACE Soccer** Long Term Player Development Philosophy. These guidelines and codes are based on the Canadian Soccer Association Fair Play codes.

The Codes of Conduct are based on the concept of fair play, defined by five basic principles:

1. Respect for the Laws of the game
2. Respect for the referees and their decisions
3. Respect for all participants, including team-mates, coaches and opponents
4. Equal participation
5. Maintaining self-control at all times

Coaches should read and discuss the Codes of Conduct with all members of the team. It is a condition of continuing **PACE Soccer** membership that all members follow the Codes of Conduct at all times.

Players and coaches will be judged based on their performance and behaviour on and off the field of play, as an individual and as a member of a team. Their personal conduct, both in and out of competition, reflects both upon **PACE Soccer** and their teams image and it is the responsibility of the players and coaches to safeguard the reputation and pride of those who they represent.

### **Player Code of Conduct**

- 1) The Player agrees to dress and wear appropriate attire whenever they are representing **PACE Soccer** and to conduct themselves at all times in a manner that will be a credit to **PACE Soccer**.
- 2) Respect and consideration must be shown towards all **PACE Soccer** staff, Technical Staff, public and all volunteers who are involved in hosting a game or tournament.
- 3) Players are reminded that in most instances, they are guests and should always conduct themselves as such.
- 4) Players must adhere to any rules set out by **PACE Soccer** and the coaching staff governing curfew at all functions and events.
- 5) The use of tobacco, consumption or possession of alcohol and illegal substances will not be tolerated. Zero tolerance is in effect.
- 6) Players agree to participate fully in the sport of soccer.
- 7) Players agree to play by the rules and in the spirit of the game.



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- 8) Players agree to respect the officials' decisions and to remember they are there to help and assist in making the game of soccer fair and enjoyable.
- 9) Players will endeavor to be a good team player and recognize that the goal of the game is to have fun, improve skills and to develop lifelong friends in both teammates and opponents.
- 10) Players agree to cooperate with coaches, officials, teammates and opponents, for without them there is no game of soccer.

### **Coaches and Club Officials Code of Conduct (herein referred to as "coach" and "coaches")**

- 1) The Coach agrees to dress and wear appropriate attire whenever they are representing **PACESoccer** and to conduct themselves at all times in a manner that will be a credit to **PACE Soccer**.
- 2) Respect and consideration must be shown towards all **PACE Soccer** members, public and all volunteers who are involved in hosting a game or tournament.
- 3) Coaches must adhere to any rules set out by **PACE Soccer**.
- 4) The use of tobacco, consumption or possession of alcohol and illegal substances while in the presence of players is not allowed.
- 5) The Coach must agree, in writing, to adhere to the **PACE Soccer** Code of Conduct and Ethics as described in this document.
- 6) Regardless of the aims and goals of a coach, the primary goal is to facilitate a learning environment that is fun, challenging and educational and develops a love for the game which enables the sport to retain as many players as possible.
- 7) Coaches will be reasonable in their demands on the young players' time, energy, and enthusiasm. Remember that they have additional interests and commitments.
- 8) Coaches will teach players to play fairly, to respect the rules, the officials, and their opponents for without them, there would be no game of soccer.
- 9) Coaches will ensure that all players get equal instruction and equal play time.
- 10) Coaches will not ridicule, shout, use profane language or gestures at players, opponents, or officials for making mistakes or for performing poorly. Coaches will remember that players play to have fun and must be encouraged to have confidence in themselves.
- 11) Coaches will make sure that equipment and facilities are safe and match the players age and abilities.
- 12) Coaches will need to communicate with parents in the management of player injuries and will need to consider the players well-being for the future when making decisions on a player's ability to play or practice.
- 13) Coaches need to remember that players need a coach they can respect.
- 14) Coaches will be generous with praise when it is deserved, and set a good example;



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- as players often learn more from what they observe rather than what they are told.
- 15) Coaches need to make a personal commitment to be informed on sound coaching principles along with the principles of growth and development of players.

### **Parent, Family, Guardians, and Spectators Code of Conduct: (here in referred to as “guardians”)**

1. Guardians agree not to force their child to participate in sports if they do not wish to be involved.
2. Guardians will strive to remember that the player is involved for their enjoyment and not their own.
3. Guardians will encourage the player to play by the rules and resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility or violence.
4. Guardians will never ridicule or shout at a player for making a mistake or performing poorly.
5. Guardians will respect the principle that doing one’s best is as important as winning, thereby reinforcing the principle that to participate is as important as the result of the game.
6. Guardians will condemn the use of violence in any sport.
7. Guardians will not use profane language or gestures towards players, opponents, officials or coaches.
8. Guardians will recognize and will remember the value and importance of volunteer coaches and officials. They give of their time and resources to provide recreational activities for their involved youth.
9. Guardians agree to respect the officials’ decisions and to remember they are there to help and assist in making the game of soccer fair and enjoyable.



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## PLAYER CODE OF CONDUCT

### Have Fun!

- I will do my best to participate because I want to, not just because my parents or coaches want me to
- I will play by the rules and in the spirit of the game
- I will control my temper – fighting and “mouthing off” can spoil the activity for everybody
- I will come to the field expecting to have fun
- I will make sure that my wants are communicated to my coach
- I will remember that winning isn’t everything – that having fun, improving skills and making friends are also important

### Try Your Hardest!

- I will work hard in practice on all drills
- I will play my hardest on game days
- If I am tired, I will ask for a substitution
- I will try my best to come ready for practices and games will come and support my team rain or shine

### Respect!

- I will encourage my team mates and not get mad at them or laugh at them if they make mistakes
- I will encourage the other team whether we are winning or loosing
- I will listen to the referee and accept their decisions regardless of whether the call was right or wrong
- I will be quiet and listen to my coach when he is giving instruction
- I will play the position my coach asks me to in a game

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## PARENT/GUARDIAN CODE OF CONDUCT

### Have Fun!

- I will not force my child to participate in sports
- I will remember that my child plays sports for their enjoyment, not mine
- I will encourage my child to play by the rules and to resolve conflicts without resorting to hostility or violence
- I will make sure that my wants are communicated to my coach

### Try Your Hardest!

- I will teach my child that doing one's best is as important as winning, so that my child will never feel defeated by the outcome of a game /event
- I will make my child feel like a winner every time by offering praise for competing fairly and trying hard
- I will do my best to ensure that my child arrives early for practices (15 minutes) and games (30 minutes) so that they are ready to play
- I will offer to help other parents if they need help getting their child to an event

### Respect!

- I will encourage the players on my child's team and not get mad at them or laugh at them if they make mistakes
- I will not coach from the side line as this only confuses the players
- I will never ridicule or yell at my child for making a mistake or losing a competition
- I will encourage the other team whether we are winning or loosing
- I will never question the officials' judgment or honesty in public
- I will respect the coaching staff and recognize that they have my child's best interests at heart
- I will bring concerns up with the coach after practices or games

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## COACH CODE OF CONDUCT

### Have Fun!

- I will make sure that equipment and facilities are safe

- I will offer to help other parents if they need help getting their child to an event

### Respect!

- I will remember that players need a coach they can respect; I will be generous with praise and set a good example
- I will be reasonable when scheduling games and practices remembering that young players have other interests and obligations
- I will teach my players to play fairly and to respect the rules, officials and opponents
- I will ensure that all players get equal instruction, support and playing time
- I will encourage the other team whether we are winning or losing
- I will never question the officials' judgment or honesty in public
